

Oregon Major Project earns hugs

The Elks Children's Eye Clinic, Major Project of the Oregon State Elks Association, would not be possible without the organization's commitment to providing eye care for babies and children.

The Elks became involved with the University of were as follows: Oregon Medical School, now the OHSU School of Medicine, in 1949. That year, Kenneth Swan, M.D., needed a piece of equipment called an oximeter for a baby whose father was an Oregon Elk. The Oregon Elks promptly raised \$2,000 for the oximeter. Soon after, their continued generosity established the Elks Children's Eye Clinic.

Since then, the Elks have contributed enormously to the growth of the clinic, helping pay for the nation's first microscope for ocular surgery, the Northwest's first ophthalmic excimer laser, and Oregon's first photokeratoscope for children. Today, the visual program of the Oregon State Elks Association contributes more than \$2,000,000 annually to the Elks Children's Eye Clinic, working with 18,000 children each year.

The Commission is grateful for the Elks who collect and donate deer hides to the National Veterans Leather Program. These hides provide occupational and recreational therapy for our disabled veterans and gloves for those confined to wheelchairs. This effort reinforces our Elk's motto: "So long as there are veterans, the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks will never forget them."

C. Thomas Naumann of Pontiac-Waterford, MI #810 has a message to Lodges about their pin designs. "Quit making the same pin over and over year after year," the avid collector said Monday, sitting amid the scrapbook-type pages filled with hundreds, if not thousands, of pins at the pins booth. "It doesn't create any new interest with pin traders.

He advised Lodges to at least change pin colors or add a date, "something to make it different, so it's noticeable." Naumann himself has some 16,000 pins he has collected over the years. He added that the need to changing pins designs is a must more than ever in this day and age of dwindling numbers in the Elks ranks.

"We've lost so many Members, there's not as much interest in pins as there used to be," Naumann said. "I'm 75. How much longer am I going to be here?"


Husband and Wife State Presidents




