On February 16th the Humane Society of the Nature Coast and the Hernando County Animal Control teamed up with the Elks.



The Elks gave an incentive of reduced fees to anyone adopting a pet from either agency,

According to Elks Treasurer Paul Stark PER anyone upon proof of spay or neutering would receive the discount, which came from a \$2,000 Gratitude Grant from our Elks National Foundation.

Joanne Schoch, Humane Society Director stated that whenever the county can lower the cost of pet adoptions, more animals are safe from euthanasia and that she was grateful to the Elks.
