# WELCOME TO AUSTIN

**ELK**OME to beautiful Austin, Texas, everyone. The city has many things to do. If you are looking for activity ideas, check Austin's online visitor guide at <u>austintexas</u>. <u>org</u> — it has tons of information.

One unique attraction that is a few short walking blocks from the Austin Convention Center is the famous flock of bats flying from their summer home under the Congress Avenue Bridge. And you can describe it with one of my favorite words: "FREE."

We are now in the middle of bat season. Each spring the bats migrate from their winter homes in Mexico. Technically, they are Mexican free-tailed bats and are over a million strong after the babies are born during their stay here. That's the largest concentration of urban bats in North America.

The bats are beneficial for pest control, as they feed on the pesky flying bugs that are common here in the South. They found an ideal place under the bridge (called the "Bat Cave") after the rebuilding of the bridge in 1980.

Be ready to watch the horde come out from the bridge any time after 45 minutes prior to sunset. There's even a special place called the Statesman Bat Observation Center adjacent to the bridge.

Again, welcome to the annual Elks National Convention. Have a great stay here in Austin.

Austin, Texas, welcomes Members of the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks for the 159th Grand Lodge Convention. Austin is the fourth largest city in the state and has been the center of state government since 1845, when Texas was admitted to the United States. Within the downtown area, visitors will find the political and cultural centers, entertainment venues, and restaurants that make Austin a vibrant city.

Austin is home to many museums and cultural sites, and one of the most recognizable landmarks is the Texas State Capitol, located at 1100 Congress Avenue. The capitol was constructed between 1885 and 1888 within 22 acres of landscaped parkland and is based on the design of Italian Renaissance buildings. The building is open to the public for guided tours that pass through many of its most important spaces.

An unusual natural phenomenon can be seen south of downtown at the Congress Avenue Bridge. From early spring through late fall, this bridge is the roosting site for the largest urban population of bats in the United States. Each night at sunset, thousands of bats fly out to begin their nightly search for food. The departure of the bats has become a major tourist attraction, so be sure to arrive before sunset for the best views.

After arriving at the Colorado River, visitors might be tempted to take a boat trip or to explore the city via the Ann and Roy Butler Hike-and-Bike Trail, which extends for five miles along both banks of the river. The trail passes through the Zilker Botanical Garden and winds around Lady Bird Lake, a reservoir in the Colorado River that is a popular spot for kayakers. Another of Austin's outstanding features is its live music scene. Many well-known music venues are located downtown on Sixth Street. Other notable venues include the low-key Cactus Cafe, located on the campus of the University of Texas; the spectacular Paramount Theatre, which boasts the decor of an old-fashioned movie palace; ACL Live at The Moody Theater, home to the popular *Austin City Limits* television show; and the Elephant Room, a renowned jazz club.

Austin is an international city with a diverse culinary scene, but it prides itself on Texas barbecue. One of the most famous barbecue restaurants in the city is Franklin Barbecue, located east of downtown at 900 East Eleventh Street. People line up by the dozen every morning to buy the restaurant's famous brisket. The spot is so popular that items often sell out within hours of the daily opening time of 11 a.m., so customers are recommended to arrive early and be prepared for a long wait. Two barbecue restaurants close to the convention center are Iron Works Barbecue, located at 100 Red River Street, and Lamberts, at 401 West 2nd Street.

Regardless of whether they're in the mood for quality barbecue, good music, cultural enrichment, or the wonders of nature, conventiongoers will find plenty to enjoy in Austin.
