Minneapolis, Minnesota, welcomes the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks to the 2023 Grand Lodge Convention. Once known as the "Flour Milling Capital of the World," Minneapolis and its sister city, Saint Paul, now form a dynamic metropolitan area with an economy based on manufacturing, healthcare, retail, and other industries. The city's downtown boasts a wealth of parks, museums, and restaurants, along with a spectacular waterfront along the Mississippi River.

Four blocks west of the Minneapolis Convention Center is Loring Park, a lightly wooded, 34-acre park that surrounds Loring Pond. Several miles of bicycle and walking trails circle the pond and provide a perfect place for exercise. At the west end of the park, a pedestrian bridge leads to the Minneapolis Sculpture Garden, home to more than 40 larger-than-life artworks, including the iconic Spoonbridge and Cherry.

Just south of the sculpture garden is the Walker Art Center, a world-class contemporary art museum. Current exhibitions include colorful quilted paintings by Filipino-American artist Pacita Abad and ceramic sculptures of everyday objects crafted by Saint Louis-based artist Kahlil Robert Irving.

For visitors more interested in shopping and dining, downtown Minneapolis stretches northeast of the convention center along Nicollet Mall and Marquette Avenue, parallel streets that form one of the city's primary shopping corridors. Fine dining options in this area include Manny's Steakhouse, known for its filets and ribeyes. Manny's is at the corner of Marquette and Ninth Street, right next to Keys at the Foshay, a café offering breakfast, lunch, and a fabulous selection of baked goods for dessert.

Northeast of downtown, visitors will find the Mississippi River and Minneapolis's many riverside parks, which cover more than 11 miles of the east and west banks of the river. West of the river, visitors will find Mill Ruins Park, which contains buildings, monuments, and other structures related to the history of the flour-milling and sawmilling industries in Minneapolis. Near Mill Ruins Park is Stone Arch Bridge, a pedestrian bridge over the Mississippi River that offers an excellent view of Saint Anthony Falls and is one of the best locations from which to watch the city's Red, White, and Boom! fireworks display on the Fourth of July.

About 10 miles south of downtown is the world-famous Mall of America. Visitors to the mall will find more than 500 stores, along with more than 50 restaurants, a theme park, an aquarium, several movie theaters, and other entertainment venues. For those without a car, the mall can be reached via the Metro, the city's light rail system, which has several downtown stops along Fifth Street, about half a mile northeast of the convention center.

With the variety of museums, parks, restaurants, and other attractions Minneapolis has to offer, convention attendees will have no shortage of things to do during their stay.
