

Reminder for Members and Their Guests

- · Keep the Social Quarters and Members Only areas closed and secured with a key card lock. No exceptions.
- · Check membership cards!!! Our members should be proud to display their cards. It does not have to be confrontational. "Hi. My name is _ Welcome to Dover Lodge. May I see vour membership card?" This is especially true of outdoor events.
- · Have all members sign in their guests in the register book. Outside events also. The member signs in the guest – not the other way around.
- Ensure that no guest pays for anything, or receives funds from gambling machines. All transactions are through the member, period. Food, drinks, raffles, ANYTHING.
- · Check all advertising, and then check it again. If the sign out front, or the Facebook post, or the ad in the paper does not specify that our "food night" is solely for our "members and guests", then the IRS will use this as evidence and it should be counted as UBI (Unrelated Business Income), therefore taxed.

MD-DE-DC State Elk Association Major Project



Elks Camp Barrett











Dover Lodge #1903 is a member of the Maryland, Delaware and District of Columbia State Elks Association. Our State Association major project is **Elks Camp Barrett**. At Camp Barrett there are baseball, football, soccer and other athletic fields, an Olympic size swimming pool, with a full bath house which includes showers, dressing room and lockers, men and women restrooms, and a washer/dryer room. There's an outside Hillside Capel (built by Scouts), a basketball court, volleyball court, archery range, shooting range, zip-line, horseshoe pits, swings, slides, etc. Surrounding the center of camp are twisting hiking trails to explore through the thick woods while crossing the Scout built bridges over the nearby running stream for a steep climb up "Hamburger Hill" (a 45 degree hill lovingly named by kids of past years). In addition to the main dining hall with its full state-of-the-art kitchen facility, offices and restrooms, there are also; two activity pavilions with many picnic tables, an Arts & Crafts Building, separate Counselors Cabins, several wooded campsites with fire-pits and a lean-to, as well as group gathering bonfire locations scattered throughout. There's a Grounds-Keeper/Caretakers House stationed at the Camp entry. For Campers housing, there are a series of 6 Bunkhouses along with a First Aid Cabin with an attached Camp Directors' Ouarters that are all jointly maintained by the 37 Elk Lodges in our State Association.

Dover Lodge sponsors a Cabin with Milford, Deale and Chestertown Lodges. Collectively, we are responsible for the maintenance and upkeep of this Cabin.

Each year Dover Lodge sponsors children between the ages of 9 to 13 for a week of Summer Camp Experience. This year, we will sponsor 6 children. If you know of a child who would not have an opportunity for a summer camping experience, please contact Connie DeYoung.

Flag Etiquette

- The flag should never be dipped
 to any person or thing. It is flown
 upside down only as a distress signal.
- The flag should not be used as a drapery, or for covering a speakers desk, draping a platform, or for any decoration in general.
- The flag should never be used for any advertising purpose.
- 4. The flag should not be used as part of a costume or athletic uniform, except that a flag patch may be used on the uniform of military personnel, fireman, policeman and members of patriotic organizations.
 - 5. The flag should never have placed on it, or attached to it, any mark, insignia, letter, word, number, figure, or drawing of any kind.
 - 6. The flag should never be used as a receptacle for receiving, holding, carrying, or delivering anything.
