

During the month of June, we made great progress on one of the three areas of focus our grant allows for—providing CPR training for the community.

We taught eleven separate CPR classes with 240 participants. One of these classes included our most recent Safe Sitter Class.

Snacks and Gatorade were provided to Camp Fury, which is a week-long camp which allows girls in 6th-12th grade to experience careers in Police/Fire/EMS.

We also assembled/delivered snack baskets to several local police departments. The extra snacks were utilized at Camp Fury and Safe Sitter events.

Bill Sweeney presented CJCares with a clip-on CO monitor and 96-9 Volt batteries for use in the smoke detectors they provide to the community. Tosha Grotenhuis presented one of our CPR instructors with a tourniquet. Virginia DeBoard presented Grandview Lodge #2088 with a Stop the Bleed kit, two boxes of Narcan and a new set of AED pads to replace the expired ones in their Lodge.


