

BOARD REPORT

The parking lot repair and restriping will be done on July 2, so please make arrangements to park outside of this area. Other improvements voted on by the Board and approved on the floor on June 25th were: two red sun shades for the deck, for a purchase price not to exceed \$700, inclusive of tax and shipping; a membership drive and open house banner for \$85, plus tax and shipping; and 1000 Elks race car postcards for \$65 plus tax and shipping. The sun shades will help keep the deck less hot and more usable in the summer. The banner is actually provided by the State Elks Membership Committee; we are paying only to have our Lodge name and number to be added. The postcards are another way of reaching out to potential members and a younger demographic. The Board did not move forward with the purchase of 8 additional lounge chairs to be used in the game room, but the floor did approve spending up to \$4000 including shipping. Part of the funding will come from a chair replacement reserve account started several years ago and part from the Steve Wicks' endowment.

Please add these dates to your calendars! Membership drives on August 27, October 12, and February 15. Further details will be distributed at a later date, but it would be great if you could plan to volunteer at these events for even one hour. Just showing up lets potentially new members know that Elks help each other and support the Lodge and community.

Bowling is happening! We are hosting the WSEA Children's Therapy Program Fundraiser Bowling Tournament on September 29 at Riverside Lanes. We will have trophies, raffles and fun! After bowling, all will retire to our Lodge for pizza, refreshments, raffle baskets, and more fun. Last year we raised over \$4000 in one afternoon! Let's top that this year! Thank you to everyone who participated in the ENF Fundraising Dinner last month and especially to those who made donations even though they couldn't attend. Because of your generosity and faithful giving, we have already qualified to receive the Gratitude Grant in 2025-2026 and have earned three of the four \$500 bonus awards offered. Most impressive is that almost 20% of our members have donated to ENF this year with four members going the extra mile and pledging a monthly automatic donation of \$5 or more by joining the Fidelity Club. Thank you so much. We will continue to work toward earning the fourth bonus which is to increase our lodge's giving by 10% over last year.

ENF sponsors a great program to help Veterans who are unhoused get the necessities they need when they can be housed. The program will reimburse the lodge up to \$400 for necessities and up to \$600 when a bed is needed. Mount Vernon Elks is working with Skagit Vet Connect social workers who help unhoused veterans find housing. This past month we received our first formal request to help a newly housed veteran get those necessities. Those items were everyday things that most of us take for granted. Items like dishes, silverware, cups, glasses, kitchen and bath towels, cleaning supplies, toilet paper, paper towels, pots and pans, cooking utensils, etc. Sandy and Wayne McFee shopped for most of the requested items with some on-line shopping by Debbie Davis. The items were delivered to Anthony Ensey, the social worker at Skagit Vets connect 3 days later and off to the Veteran who was moving in that day. ENF Welcome Home program approved all the purchases and reimbursed the lodge \$400. The additional \$137 spent was approved for reimbursement from the lodge veterans fund at the Lodge meeting on June 11. We hope to help more veterans in the future as they become housed. Thank you members!! This is a great example of your ENF dollars at work!!

On Sunday, August 4th, our lodge will be partnering with Heart to Heart Charity to host our third annual Back to School/Family Freebie Event for local children and their families. At this event, children will be receiving backpacks filled with their school's requested supplies. The children and their families will be fed a hotdog lunch hosted by the Elks and be able to choose clothing, household goods and toys that have been donated for this event.

The backpacks and school supplies gifted at this event come from Community and Elks member donations. This year, our lodge will be using the \$2000 ENF Gratitude Grant to purchase backpacks and school supplies for approx. 15 children. School Supply lists can cost up to \$150 per student which is a real struggle if you are a single mom with multiple children. Last year, with community support we were able to provide about 54 children with backpacks and school supplies and about 200 people total attended this event.

If members wish to sponsor a student by purchasing the items on their school supply list, you can contact ENF Chair, Debbie Denton at Debbie.dentonl@gmail.com or join the Heart to Heart Facebook page "Sponsor a Student H2HC". If you choose to sponsor a child directly through the Facebook page, please let Debbie know so that we can be sure to include your giving in our grant report.





Donate School Supplies or Sponsor a
Student – Commonly needed school supplies are paper,

pencils, crayons, glue sticks and highlighters. Schools are also asking for Clorox wipes, paper towels, gallon baggies, and Kleenex. Donated school supplies can be left in the donation box in the lodge hallway.

Donate Hotdogs – 4th of July is a good time to purchase these as they are usually on sale. We can store them in the lodge freezer until the event. Please bring them to the lodge by August 1 so we know how many we still need to purchase. We will use approx. 200 hotdogs.

Donate Potato Chips – In the past, we have given the small bags but the price has increased so much we will just use larger Party size bags this year and portion them out. You can bring them to the lodge at any time but please do so no later than August 1 so we know how many we need to purchase.

Donate Gently used clothing or kitchen items – These can be brought to the lodge between 9 and 11 on October 4th. If you know people with children, encourage them to go through their clothes and donate them to us. One of our charities desperately needs men's clothes.
