




AN ELK PROFILE VIC WADE

Vic's story is similar to a cat with nine lives. He was the only child of a family in the grocery business. His father owned and operated Wade's IGA in Paris, Missouri which he purchased in 1946. In high school, Vic enjoyed playing basketball and also participated in the Junior play where he was Claude the caretaker of a hotel. In his Junior year he contracted polio in spite of being vaccinated. He was forced to give up basketball. This slowed him down considerably while he received treatments and physical therapy. In his Senior year he was Manager of the baseball team. He had another near miss with his health when his father discovered that he and his friends got into his whisky bottle and replaced what they drank with water. That was a one-time thing. After graduating from high school, Vic attended college at Kirksville Teachers College. After completing his first year, he realized he was going to be drafted when his birthday was assigned a low draft lottery number. He decided to join the Air Force in 1964 along with five other young men in his town. In 1966 he received orders to go to Viet Nam. Three days before departing, he and two other airmen went to a G.I. bar in Texas where they were stationed. A Viet Nam protestor in the bar shot all three of them after a misunderstanding. Vic was shot twice. He spent eleven months in the hospital. After recuperating he was no longer able to do his job as loadmaster. He became part of a team of ten airmen who went from base to base converting them from manual to computer systems. His military service spanned from 1964 until 1968 when he took a medical retirement. When he returned home, he went to work at Wades IGA where he worked for 43 years as a meat cutter and part owner. He met his wife Terrie at the store. She worked for Shell Oil Company. Before going on vacation one year, she purchased some flowers for the company. The store was to hold them until she returned. Vic was assigned the job of watering them. When she came to pick them up, he saw her for the first time and asked if this was the woman responsible for his extra duties. They ended up dating and married in October of 1999. Together they have three kids and eleven grandchildren. After retiring, Vic and Terrie bought a house in Port Boliver across the bay from Galveston. They survived hurricanes Rita and Ike. The house was totaled by Ike. They rebuilt it and decided to move here in 2013. In addition to being an Elk, Vic is a member of the Lake of The Ozarks Shrine Club. Over the past twenty-five years, he has gone through the ranks of Master Mason, Scottish Rite and York Rite. He served one year as Rajah of the local Shrine Club. For fourteen of those years he greatly enjoyed his role as Mr. Wobbles The Clown. You may have seen him in our Veterans Parade. Fourteen years ago Vic became an Elk. He has been very active on our Veterans Committee and also spent a lot of time helping Bill Morris bring Bingo to our lodge on Sundays. In his spare time he enjoys playing golf, pool and dominoes. He works out at the hospital three times a week. In addition to helping with the veterans, Vic enjoys (3114) socializing with friends in the lounge.
