October is generally Fire Prevention Month in the U.S Fire Service, but more specifically according to the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) the 6th through the 12th is Fire Prevention Week and this year's theme is "Smoke alarms: Make them work for you!" Fire Prevention month commemorates the Great Chicago Fire of 1871, which killed more than 250 people, left 100,000 homeless and destroyed more than 17,400 buildings. (NFPA 2024)

The three main goals of Fire Prevention Month (Week) are aimed to stop fires from occurring by: suppression measures aimed to control fires and evacuation measures to safely move occupants to a safe location.

In laymen's terms this means to have a fire extinguisher that is easily accessible in your home. Be proficient in using this fire extinguisher in order to extinguish small fires that can be easily and safely controlled. Also, have working smoke detectors on each floor of your home, especially outside of each bedroom when possible. Make sure these detectors are in good working order. Those that still use 9 volt batteries should be changed at least yearly. Remember when you set your clocks back/forward check or change those batteries in your detectors. There are the newer long life batteries now offered in most new smoke detectors and if this is the case at least test them when resetting your clocks. Lastly, have an exit plan that you can share and teach each family member in case of a fire.

Throughout my almost 36 year career in the fire service I have seen first-hand the utter devastation that an uncontrolled fire can do to a home, not to mention the lives lost because occupants did not have a working smoke detector in their homes. Take a few minutes to check your smoke detectors to ensure they are in good working order. Consider purchasing an extinguisher and always have an exit plan for you and your family.

A house fire can devastate you and your family so please ensure that properly functioning smoke detectors are in place to give you an early alert to get out safely and alive.

Freedom to Serve with Freedom Grants

Lodges all over the country are working diligently and creatively to meet the needs of veterans within their communities with funding from ENVSC's Freedom Grant program. Read about two Lodges making a difference with Freedom Grants below.

GRANT CORNER...OCTOBER

As with all grants, there is an application process. While the Impact Grant has a two-step application process, all remaining grants have a single application that is specific to the grant purpose. All grants must serve specific populations in the Lodge's community, such as people experiencing homelessness or facing food insecurity, survivors of abuse, students from families that are under-resourced, people with disabilities, or individuals facing other barriers. [1]

The Beacon Grant is open to every Lodge, and the GER's per-member-giving goal does not need to be met to apply for this \$4000 grant. [2]

The application questions are as follows:

What is the Lodge's Beacon Grant project?

What community need is being addressed? Why is this a pressing need in your community? How will the Lodge identify and serve the intended audience? Include relevant community statistics and details regarding partner organizations to support your assertion.

Beacon Grants require active Lodge participation. How will Lodge members be meaningfully involved in this project? What are their duties and responsibilities?

How will the Lodge know it was successful? What is the measure of success?

While the Impact Grant requires quarterly reporting, the Beacon Grant, along with all other grants, only require a year-end report.

The Beacon Grant also requires categorization and intended audience. Since 2021, the Lodge has used the Beacon Grant to provide supplemental pantry items not available through Harvesters or affordable with residents' food stamps for two Section 8 senior apartment facilities within Blue Springs. The grant monies also provide Thanksgiving and Christmas meals to residents. Thus, our grant is categorized as Food Pantry/ Distribution and Supplies/Equipment. Our audience is defined as: Elderly, Hunger Issues, and the Poor.

Linda Gregory recently came up with a fun idea to offer a "snack basket" raffle full of delicious, sweet treats several times throughout the year. This has been a tremendous hit with the residents.

As with all grants, the ENF looks for *active* participation by Lodge members. If you are interested in assisting with this project, please reach out to Curt Zollers at cezollers@gmail.com or 816-820-0342. Duties include pickup and delivery of grocery items, setting up the "pantry" once per month, and food preparation/delivery/serving of holiday meals at both apartment facilities. The next holiday meal is set for Thanksgiving weekend. Donations of snack basket goodies are always appreciated.
