

LIFE MEMBERSHPS

Members, the Boise Elks Lodge #310 currently has the possibility of electing new Life Members. Our Bylaws require that we have no more than 10% of our membership be Life Members or Honorary Life members. NEW Life Members must be restricted to no more than 15 (this would allow us to still be within by-laws limits). We have more than 59 members who are eligible for life membership.

You are considered an eligible member if you have at least 30 years as an Elk, you are at least age 65, and your current years dues are paid. If you wish to be a part of the possible candidates for these new Life Member slots, you will need to send a Letter (or e-mail) to the Lodge indicating that you want to be a part of the eligible candidates, no later than December 1st 2024

The 2025 Most Valuable Student scholarship application is now open!

Eligibility: Current high school seniors, or the equivalent, who are citizens of the United States are eligible to apply. Applicants do not need to be related to a member of the Elks. High school graduates are not eligible to apply. Applicants must be citizens of the United States on the date their applications are submitted; permanent legal resident status does not qualify.

The 2025 MVS application closes on November 12, 2024 at 11:59 p.m. Pacific Time.

If you have someone that you know that can use this scholarship please let them know.

Legacy Awards are \$4,000 scholarships available to children and grandchildren of Elks members.

The 2025 contest and application will open on September 1, 2024.

For the 2025 contest, any child or grandchild (or step-child, step-grandchild, or legal ward) of a living Elk who joined the Order on or before April 1, 2022, or a charter member of a Lodge that was instituted on or after April 1, 2022, is eligible to apply. The Elk must also be a paid-up member through March 31, 2025. Great-grandchildren are not eligible. The applicant must be a high school senior. The applicant must apply online only. The 2025 Legacy Awards application deadline is February 3, 2025, 11:59 a.m. Pacific Time. NOTE: This is NOON, mid-day, Pacific time.

Rules

At the time of the contest, eligible participants must be Students enrolled in one of these four divisions: I—5th grade; II—6th grade; III—7th grade; or IV—8th grade.

Essay length is not to exceed 300 words.

Essay must be typed or legibly printed in ink. Also, Essay must be submitted as written (or typed) by the entrant.

Essay must be submitted for judging to the Elks Lodge nearest to the address of the entrant.

Participant must be identified by name, grade, school attending and sponsoring Elks Lodge on the Essay.

Awards

Plaques will be awarded by Grand Lodge for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd Place for national winning essays in Divisions I, II, III, and IV. Monetary awards will be disbursed for each grade level for 1st Place—\$1,000; 2nd Place—\$500; and 3rd Place—\$250. Winners will be announced at the Grand Lodge Session.

Application Packet

All applications must include the coverpage to identify the student and local Elks Lodge it is submitted to. Essay should be submitted to your nearest local Elks Lodge on/before December 15, 2024.
