Boos is a past exalted ruler of Hell Gate, Montana, Lodge No. 383, he having assisted at the organization of that unit in Elidom in 1897, demitted there from Helena Lodge No. 193, where he became an Elk in 1891. In 1901 Bro. Boos demitted from Hell Gate Lodge to Washington Lodge No. 15, and from the national capital he came to Seattle and affiliated with No. 92 in 1909.

In 1912 he demitted from Seattle at

came to Seattle and affiliated with No. 32 in 1909.

In 1912 he demitted from Seattle to Medford, Ore., Lodge No. 1168, and in 1917 he once more returned to Seattle, rejoining No. 92. Thus in his thirty-two years of membership in the order. Bro. Boos has demitted five times and been an active and energetic worker in four lodges, Seattle claiming him twice, and he is still a local Bill. Bro. Boos is always ready and willing to assist any enterprise prompted or fostered by Elkdom, and his cheerful presence is typical of the spirit of Elkdom.
