November 23 is Thanksgiving, a day for us to thank God for all the blessings that have been bestowed on each of us, our family, our friends, our Order, and our great country. It is also a day we ask for the blessings of God to guide us and show us ways to help those who are less fortunate so we may make their life better, proving "Elks Care — Elks Share." ### Volunteers, donations help to fulfill Elks' pledge

"So long as there are veterans, the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks will never forget them."

Thanks to all of you, that pledge is as true today as it was in 1918, when the Elks built a 700 bed hospital in Boston and donated it to the government, helping to create a precursor for today's VA Medical Centers.

It's good to recognize our impressive past. This Veterans Remembrance Month, be sure to also celebrate the amazing things Elks Members do to serve today's veterans.

Elks have been actively involved in the VA Voluntary Service since shortly after the program began in 1946. Today, through the Elks Voluntary Service Program, we have 607 Elks Representatives and Deputy Representatives stationed in more than 360 VA Medical Centers, State Veterans Homes, veterans shelters, and clinics across the country. We spend hundreds of thousands of dollars each month in support of these veterans, hosting activities, buying supplies, improving access to healthcare, and offering friendship and support.

Since we launched the Welcome Home program in 2015, we've helped more than 11,000 veterans exiting homelessness and moving into new homes by providing them with beds, furniture, dishes, and other needed home supplies. We've served thousands more veterans in shelters and in communities by offering wraparound support like food, job training, educational assistance, and other needed services. In partnership with VA social workers, we've granted more than \$6.1 million in emergency financial assistance to 3,719 veterans to help them exit or prevent homelessness. Each of these veterans received an average of \$1,656 in assistance with rent, security deposits, or utilities, demonstrating that a relatively small amount of money at the right time can make a world of difference to a veteran in need.

For nearly 75 years, Elks have been partnering with hunters across the country to collect hides for veterans through the Veterans Leather Program. The finished leather is then used for wheelchair gloves, craft kits, and recreation therapy programs. Last year, Elks collected 16,229 hides. We distributed 1,378 pairs of wheelchair gloves to veterans, often at Elks-sponsored adaptive sports events. We also donated more than 64,587 square feet of leather to our partner Help Heal Veterans, which turns this leather into craft kits to help recovering veterans.


Altogether, the value of Elks service to veterans last year was more than \$36 million, which is an incredible number. Our past is impressive, but so is our present -day service. This Veterans Remembrance Month, let the Elks' history of service inspire you to continue the tradition into the future.

Some parents expressed that their child wouldn't get on stage and sing but then something happens and that shy, timid girl is on stage singing her favorite song and hermom is tearing up. It is truly magical to watch these things play out and these individuals develop before your eyes in a safe, free, fun, peer group setting. I am filled with joy for each triumph of each of these people no matter how big or small, a triumph is a triumph and being part of that is very exciting.

Our group ranges in ages which never matters and if you look around the room, there are smiles for miles and lots of hugging. Having technical difficulties, no problem, you are met with understanding, singing off key, you are met with cheers and clapping, shyness or timidity, you are met with back up dancers... honestly the acceptance of this community is truly astounding; they rush to take care of anyone/ everyone in need! It's their special needs special gift. □□ Otto has since turned 21 and joined the Elks. n Observing proper protocol as set forth in the Grand Lodge Manual On Protocol (Code 510600). Download at: www.grandlodge/manuals/grandlodge.

n Proper discharge of duties assigned to you. Leading Knight must attend the Clinics of the District Deputy Grand Exalted Ruler for the District in which the Lodge is located unless excused for good cause. (Every effort should be made to avoid any conflict with this duty). The Monthly Checklist—Reporting and Activities Calendar (Appendix EXHIBIT G) itemizes administrative requirements in conducting Lodge affairs. It should be a constant reference.

- 1. Attend and participate in all Lodge meetings.
- 2. Attend and participate in all Governing Board and Trustee meetings.
- 3. Attend and participate in all Monthly Knight/ER meetings.
- **4.** Participate and take active roles in mandatory Grand Lodge programs such as Flag Day, Elks Memorial, etc..

Thanks to the Elks, this veteran is no longer scrambling to find a space at a crowded shelter or worrying about where to get clean water. This veteran is now safely home.

During a workday, letters like these can make you stop in your tracks and appreciate the moment. Those displays are important.


