
As I'm sure most of you know there are 30 Elks Lodges in the state of Connecticut. Have you considered

- > Trap is open to the public. *Eye and hearing* protection are required in order to use the range and shoot trap. <u>Starts at 11am.</u>
- > Reminder: 2202 members can bring a guest to the range twice after which the guest must become a member of 2202 to continue to come to the range. (this does not apply to immediate family members).
- > Range Committee meets the 2nd Wednesday of the month at 6:30pm.



Anyone unauthorized, found to be at the range, will be prosecuted.

New Requirements for Steel Targets!

All steel targets must move!

i.e. swing, deflect down or spin. (AR500 or AR550 Steel Recommended)

ABSOLUTELY NO stationary steel targets allowed!

*This means not leaning on the backstop or propped up by wood, stone or any other material.







Minimum Distances Required:

(metal targets):

- 30 FEET for .22 caliber rimfire pistol and rimfire rifle.
- 25 YARDS for centerfire handguns (9mm, .38 caliber etc.) and shot guns shooting lead shot.
- 100 YARDS for centerfire rifle (.556, 308, 30-30, .50 caliber, etc.) and shotguns shooting slugs.


















