By-Laws to be Voted on September 3, 2024

The following are amendments to the current Quincy Elks bylaws

#1: Article IX: Club Operations and Management

Section 1- The operation, management, and control of the Home, Club, or other facility owned and/or Occupied by this Lodge shall be supervised and conducted by: A house Committee consisting of seven Members to be appointed by the Exalted Ruler.

Recommended Change:

Section 1- The operation, management, and control of the Home, Club, or other facility owned and/or occupied by this Lodge shall be supervised and conducted by: By the Board of Directors of the Corporation formed under section 16.020 which is composed of the four Chair Officers of the Lodge, the Secretary, the Treasurer, and the Trustees (5).

#5: The Club Room will be for Members only, in good standing, with the Quincy Lodge or Visitors from other Lodges and guests.

Recommended Change: The Club Room will be for Members and their Guests and Visitors from other Lodges. Visitors should sign in at the North entrance.

5A: Each Member may have a limited number of guests at the discretion of the Club Manager or House Committee.

Recommended Change: Each Member may have a limited number of guests at the discretion of the Club Manager or the Managing Body of the Club.

#5B: Minors in the Club Room must be accompanied by an adult member.

Recommended Change: Moved to #19

#5D: Guests are limited to 3 visits per Elk fraternal year

#5E: All guests must sign the Guest Register for each visit.

#5G: Guests are to enter the Lodge with the Member or be met at the entrance by the member Recommended Change: Delete All

#9: The Club Manager will report to the House Committee of the Lodge and shall receive instructions from no other source.

Recommended Change: The Club Manager will report to the Managing Body of the Lodge and shall receive instructions from no other source.

#19 (new)

- During our dances the dance floor is for dancing only.
- No Eating or Drinking is allowed on the floor.
- No children allowed on the dance floor without an adult.

• Minors in the Club Room must be accompanied by an adult member. Attire **Attire**

#1: Gentlemen may wear hats in the Members Lounge/Bar Area only. Exceptions will be made for special occasions such as theme dances, etc. in the Banquet area.

Recommended Change: Delete #1

#2: No shirt, no shoes, no service

Recommended Change:

- No shirt, no shoes, no service or entrance to the Lodge.
- Proper and appropriate clothing shall always be worn in the Lodge
- No vulgar or offensive shirts or hats should be worn.
- No sleeveless T-shirts for men




