Little League baseball, Veterans, Food Banks, and the Dictionary program. Several other programs like Drug Awareness and Hoop Shoot are funded by ENF. If we do not meet the goal, we will not be qualified to apply for grants next year. Our Lodge has until March 15th to meet the \$4.80 per member goal. ENF is a great program and I have only covered a very small part of the programs. Please if you can make a donation it would help in so many ways. Our annual dues statement should have arrived or will shortly. You can make a donation with your dues payment if you prefer.

Our key card system is in place and ready to go live if it is not already as of this writing. Once you have your key card it is yours to keep. The Lodge will NOT be issuing key cards every year. Your key card is good as long as your dues are current.

Have you noticed the HUGE screen TV mounted in the lodge room? It was DONATED by a group of members who saw a need and filled it. Thank you to all who were part of the TV donation. Great members doing good things.

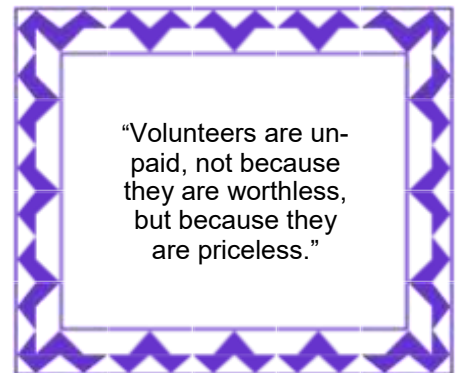

What is a Dimit and Why Would I Use One?

If you will not be renewing your membership in Mesquite Lodge #2811 this year, please request an Absolute Dimit from the Lodge Secretary prior to March 31, 2022. An Absolute Dimit benefits you in the future and benefits the Lodge now. Your benefit: If you allow your dues to lapse for whatever reason, then by the end of the year you will be dropped from the membership rolls. At such time as you wish to reinstate, a \$25.00 reinstatement fee will be assessed. Think of an Absolute Dimit as a temporary leave of absence. Lodge benefit: If you take an Absolute Dimit prior to March 31, 2022 your membership is essentially put on hold and the Lodge is not assessed a per capita fee which must be paid for every member on the rolls as of April 1. Without the Absolute Dimit, the Lodge will pay a per capita of \$24.00 on your behalf with no revenue to cover this expense. So, if you are not going to renew this year, please secure a savings for your future return to Elkdom, and help reduce the loss of Lodge revenue, by requesting an Absolute Dimit. Contact the Lodge at (702) 345-2811.

Your Lodge needs you and the community does also.

Elks National Foundation (ENF) is the Elks Charity program that provides funds to the local Lodges in the form of grants. ENF supports scholarship programs, Veterans Programs and Community Improvement Programs along with several other programs.

Our Lodge is falling short of the Grand Exalted Rulers Elks National Foundation (ENF) donation goal of \$4.80 per member. Our Lodge donation per member is at \$3.15 per member. It is important that our Lodge meet the \$4.80 ENF goal for several reasons. This year we received grants from ENF that funded a \$3,500.00 donation to Mesquite Veterans Center, \$2,500.00 grant to Virgin Valley Food Bank, \$1,500.00 to pay for the Dictionaries that were provided to each 3rd grade student in our service area.

A requirement to obtain an ENF Grant is that the Lodge meet the \$4.80 per member goal. If our Lodge fails to meet the goal, we will NOT qualify to obtain grants next year. Failure will result in less funds to support the dictionary program and other donations to the community like the Veterans Center and the Food Bank.

With the ups and downs of the Covid over the last few years it has been difficult to keep up with many things. This is one that needs our attention.

In the coming weeks you will see events and drawings focused on increasing our donations to ENF. We need your support to meet the \$4.80 goal.

Please support the Lodge by attending events and taking part in the drawings. You can make a direct donation to ENF at the Lodge. Every bit helps!

We have until March 15th to raise our per member goal, so time is limited.

The Elks Legacy Scholarships deadline is also this month. Remember, this scholarship is for any Elks Member's children and grandchildren. Make sure your Members are aware of this program.
