NOTICE

Our Lodge is in negotiations with <u>HOLLADAY PROPERTY</u> <u>SERVICES MIDWEST, INC.</u>, 3454 Douglas Road, South Bend, IN, 44635. to sell our property. It is anticipated that at one of the Regular Lodge meetings in September, a purchase agreement will be brought to the floor of the Lodge. The terms of the sale will be put forth in a resolution to the floor of the Lodge for a vote by all of the members in good standing as per GL Statutes 16.050.

The written proposal will be read on the Lodge floor at least two but not more than eight weeks prior to the scheduled date for a vote of the Lodge on the proposal setting forth the following applicable information:

- 1. Purpose of project.
- 2. Any amount to be expended.
- 3. Any amount of indebtedness to be created.
- 4. The Person(s) to be authorized to act for the Lodge.
- 5. Amount to be received by the Lodge.

AND— The proposal read on the floor of the Lodge, together with a Notice setting forth the date, time and location of the regular or special meeting at which the proposal will be voted upon, will be provided to each Member of the Lodge in accordance with the provisions of Section 1.115 at least ten (10) days prior to the date of the scheduled meeting. Note that Section 1.115 provides that any notice required to be sent or mailed to all Members of a Lodge may be included in the Lodge Bulletin or sent electronically to any Member who has given written authorization to receive notices electronically.

Joliet Elks Lodge #296 would seek to retain the income from the cell towers and the billboards by means of a permanent easement.

Joliet Elks Lodge #296 will retain the proceeds to pay regular expenses while seeking a **temporary** lease location prior to locating a permanent facility. Please attend all Lodge meetings to learn the latest in the negotiations. Also note that the completion of the sale, if approved by all parties would not occur in the immediate future. Discussions will also be ongoing as to where our Lodge should temporarily reside, and what next steps should be undertaken to secure a location.

ENF SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES



The 2025 application for Most Valuable Student Scholarships will be available on August 1, 2024. Applicants will be judged on scholarship, leadership, and financial need. The ENF awards of \$2.500,000 in MVS scholarships; and every top 20 MVS scholar will receive \$30,000!

Eligibility:

- Current high school seniors, or the equivalent, who are citizens of the United States are eligible to apply.
- Applicants **do not** need to be related to a member of the Elks.
- High school graduates are not eligible to apply.
- Applicants must be citizens of the United States on the date their applications are submitted; permanent legal resident status does not qualify.

Awards:

- The Elks National Foundation will award 500 four-year scholarships to the highest-rated applicants in the 2025 competition.
- Male and female students compete separately.
- Ranging from \$1,000 per year to \$7,500 per year, Most Valuable Student scholarships are for students pursuing a fouryear degree, on a full-time basis (minimum of 12 semester hours), in a U.S. college or university. All scholarships are in the form of certificates of award conditional upon the full-time enrollment of the winner in an accredited U.S. college or university.
- NOTE: The Chicago office of the Elks National Foundation announced the 500 national winners of the 2024 contest in April 2024.

GREAT TIME IN AUSTINDelegates from across the United States, Guam, Puerto Rico, the Philippines, and the Panama Canal met in Austin, Texas, from June 30 to July 3, 2024, for the 159th annual National Convention of the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks of the United States of America. Hosted at the Austin Convention Center and headquartered at the Hilton Austin, this convention marked a significant gathering of over 6,600 Elks members nationwide.

The Elks National Convention highlighted the organization's commitment to charitable giving and community service. Founded 157 years ago, the Elks have donated over \$12 billion to charitable causes, including \$504 million in the past year alone. Recognized as one of America's leading patriotic and charitable organizations, the Elks play a crucial role in enhancing communities across the nation.

At the convention, the Elks honored the top recipients of the Elks Most Valuable Student Scholarship Program, awarding each top boy and girl with a \$50,000 college scholarship. Additionally, the Elks annually grant \$4.5 million in college scholarships nationwide through various programs and invest \$16.3 million through the Elks Community Investment Program to enrich local communities.

In support of veterans, the Elks have allocated \$5.7 million to their Veterans Service Program, providing vital aid and comfort to veterans in need.

To further their impact, the Elks National Foundation has granted \$11.2 million to state Elks associations, funding charitable activities and initiatives across the country.

"With 1,865 lodges nationwide, the Elks organization continues to grow, welcoming members who are American citizens aged 21 and above and share a belief in God," said Rick Gathen, convention spokesperson.

JOLIET ELKS, OUR FIRST 129 YEARS

With the swearing in of Nathaniel Duke as Exalted Ruler, and installation of Officers on February 19, 1895, Joliet Elks Lodge 296 began its journey into the "mysteries of the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks."

That's how J. W. White, Past Exalted Ruler of Chicago Lodge 34, recorded the historic moment as secretary for the institution and installation of officers to organize the Lodge in Allen's Hall in downtown Joliet

District Deputy Lester Stevens presided over the institution and installation of officers and induction of 56 members to the new Lodge. Following incorporation of the Lodge on March 16, 1895, the Lodge held its first election of officers by its members on March 29, 1895. The first election was an active affair with six brothers seeking the Exalted Ruler's position.

Dedication of the Lodge Hall on the third floor of Allen's Hall was held June 5, 1895. According to the minutes, "After the building of the Altar, the Rev. Henry Perry was introduced as the Grand Orator. He delivered an eloquent address, explaining the fundamental principals of the Order, extolling all members to keep in view the obligations they have taken on themselves to bring honor and credit to themselves and the Order."

Some of the original members of the Lodge were Jacob C. Adler, Jr., Moses Duso, and John McFadden, Jr., all relatives of the current editor. (Fancy that!, *ed.*)
