



This should prove to bring a wide variety of essays and we look forward to reading the different interpretations of this year's subject.



Veterans Transition Center Lightfighter Village

Lightfighter Village is a 71-unit affordable housing project, exclusively for Veterans and their families. The project is a partnership between two non-profits: EAH Housing and Veterans Transition Center of California (VTC). The housing village is being built on VTC property in Marina and is named after the 7th Infantry Division, the Lightfighters, that served as the host unit on the old Fort Ord.



VTC will provide all wrap around services for Lightfighter Village including case management, counseling, food, clothing, and transportation.

Construction is targeted to finish in late December and the Village will officially open in January 2025, and feature an extensive library courtesy of the **Monterey Elks Lodge**. A formal ribbon cutting will be scheduled in May.

2025 LEGACY AWARD

Legacy Awards are \$4,000 scholarships available to children and grandchildren of Elks members.

The student must complete and submit the ONLINE application by **February 3, 2025 at 11:59 a.m. Pacific Time**. **APPLY NOW** at https://www.elks.org/legacyscholarship/

Who is Eligible?

- 1. Any child or grandchild (or step-child, step-grandchild, or legal ward) of a living Elk who joined the Order on or before April 1, 2022, or a charter member of a Lodge that was instituted on or after April 1, 2022, is eligible to apply. The Elk must also be a paid-up member through March 31, 2025. Great-grandchildren are not eligible.
- 2. The applicant must be a high school senior.
- 3. The applicant must apply online only.
- 4. If the applicant's parent and grandparent are both Elk members, the applicant must apply through the parent's Elks Lodge.
- 5. We have waived the standardized test requirement for the 2025 Legacy contest. You do not need to submit ACT and/or SAT scores.
- 6. Students may apply for more than one ENF scholarship; however, they may win only one. In cases where the student wins more than one, we will award the scholarship with the greater value. Students can accept local and state scholarships, which are separate from the awards at the national level.

7. Legacy Awards may only be applied to accredited US American schools, colleges, or universities.


